Procurement Policy Pipeline - Principles

- The Policy Development Pipeline is in date order, starting from the most recent Policy Review
- Procurement Policy Notes (PPNs) will be reviewed every 5 years (as a minimum)
- Policies will be updated following stakeholder engagement as outlined in the Public Procurement Stakeholder Engagement Strategy
- Executive Approval will be sought for revisions to existing PPNs or new PPNs
- The Pipeline will be updated on a quarterly basis
