		There is a risk that the tenderer could be discouraged from competing for future competitions if information identified as being commercially sensitive is released, thereby reducing the competitive market that the department would be able to draw from.  Disclosing such information may also negatively impact on the department's reputation.
Request for details of tender submissions and ranking		The other tenderer withdrew their bid prior to award. It is not of benefit to the public in releasing their name, as they were not awarded a contract.

## PUBLIC INTEREST DECISION:

After weighing up the competing public interest considerations, we consider it is reasonable in the circumstances that the information should be withheld from disclosure. Disclosure could harm KHG Toilet Hires commercial and therefore weaken KHGs position in a competitive environment by releasing sensitive information or information that may be potentially useful in a negotiating position. This is under exemption 43 Commercial Interests and that the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
